Can individuals contribute to Crime Stoppers reward?

In the wake of Monday's mass shooting, where four people died and at least 10 others were injured, police investigators are still trying to reconstruct the sequence of events and identify suspects.

A reader wrote to West Side Connect asking whether individuals can contribute to the \$5,000 reward offered by Crime Stoppers:

Yes, you can, say CMPD detective Adrian Johnson, who coordinates Crime Stoppers.

- **1. Via** the Crime Stoppers website.
- **2. By mail:** Checks can be made out to Charlotte-Mecklenburg Crime Stoppers and sent to P.O. Box 34392, Charlotte, NC 28234-4392.
- **3. By PayPal:** Donations should be entered as a gift and not a payment for services. Also, if the payment is for a particular case:

Indicate which case in the notes;

The amount for the reward;

How long you want the reward to last;

Plans for the reward money if no arrest is made. For example, donate the money to Crime Stoppers, extend the reward time frame, or return the donation.

<u>Center City Small Business Innovation Fund grant application</u> <u>process is open</u>

Small businesses in Historic West End impacted by the pandemic can now apply for grants up to \$40,000. The fund is designed to help small businesses in and around Uptown innovate and adapt to the new economic realities. Priority for grants will be given to businesses owned by minorities, women and veterans.

Businesses that received funds from Covid-19 relief programs are still eligible for this fund. The **deadline** to apply for this first round is July 10; applicants will be notified of their status by Aug. 1.


