

• Make sure you can breathe easily.

Do **NOT** use a face covering on children under age two. Children over two and under age eleven are not required to wear a face covering in public, but can if they are able to wear one safely. For more information, read the NCDHHS Requirements for the Use of Face Coverings and Masks.
