Dorothy R. Santos is a Filipina American writer, artist and educator with a focus on feminist media histories, critical medical anthropology, race and technology. She is a Ph.D. student in Film & Digital Media at the University of California, Santa Cruz as a

Eugene V. Cota-Robles fellow, and is co-founder of REFRESH, a politically-engaged art and curatorial collective.
