

Below she shares a bit of her story and what brings her to her new role as Community Development Manager at Profound Gentlemen.

I have served eight years in the social sector, but my advocacy work began in high school campaigning for Invisible Children, an organization focused on ending the recruitment of child soldiers in Uganda. Since then, I have not stopped being a voice for underserved communities and preparing others around me to do the same.



In 2008, I moved from Texas to the East Coast to attend Davidson College. I participated in a variety of service opportunities at Davidson; however, my study abroad experiences in Bolivia solidified my commitment to highlighting voices that are silenced. After Davidson, I served as an Educator in Japan, an experience that cultivated my passion for providing access to quality education. Before returning to Charlotte, I received my Masters in International Education Development at George Washington University and with the International Youth Foundation (IYF) on their youth social entrepreneurship youth development program. My work with IYF strengthened my desire to grow and empower young people to garner social change in their communities. I carried that interest into my role as a Youth Development Coordinator at Communities in Schools in Charlotte, where I learned firsthand the challenges our children experience at school and the systems of oppression that continue to work against the success of black and brown children. Serving as an Assistant Director of Civic Engagement/ Director of Freedom Schools showed me the importance of operating within my purpose and sent me on a path of rediscovering my natural gifts and aligning those with the things I care about and my
