

"We only expect one thing on Beatties Ford Road, and that is to protect and serve everybody and treat the corridor as though it was SouthPark," he said.

In the last month, five people -- including a 14-year-old boy -- have lost their lives to gun violence on the corridor.

At tomorrow's council meeting, CMPD Chief Johnny Jennings and City Manager Marcus Jones are expected to address Graham's concerns.

Black architects, interior designers sought for Excelsior Club redevelopment

The new owners of the historic Excelsior Club are seeking Black architects and interior designers to help redevelop and revive the historic site.

In January, California-based Kenwood Investments paid \$1.35 million to purchase the building, with an <u>additional \$250,000 kicked in</u> from the city, county, the Knight Foundation and Foundation For The Carolinas.

On Tuesday. CEO Darius Anderson said the project will hire a "dream team" of Black architects over the next two months to develop concepts for the remodeling of the Excelsior Club. Plans also include building a boutique hotel on the property.
