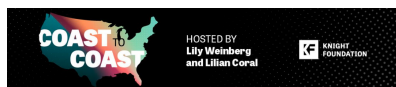

Sandra Clark is vice president for news and civic dialogue at WHYY, the Philadelphia region's leading public media outlet. Clark, who joined WHYY in 2016, is a member of the executive leadership team and manages all news operations for radio, television and digital media. In addition, she leads digital

transformation and audience diversification initiatives at the station. **Maitreyi Roy** serves as executive director for Bartram's Garden, a 50-acre free public park and National Historic Landmark located on the Tidal Schuylkill River in Southwest Philadelphia. Once known as Lenapehoking, the home of the indigenous Lenni Lenape, the Garden was founded in 1728 by John Bartram (1699–1777), an acclaimed colonial botanist, and is the country's oldest surviving botanical garden.
