Please share the following with the Tuesday Morning Forum attendees:

As the pandemic entered the nation, Constance Lav Johnson submitted her school program to the NC Governor's pandemic board members before they began meeting, with copies also sent to Governor Cooper. She had begun patenting the project considering there were no existing K-12 Online Schools. She opened School Firsts LLC, an online school providing online classrooms to public and private teachers, and first introduced the program to the Superintendents of the NC School Districts the first part of April.

Governor Cooper took Johnson's materials, created a presentation for the media, sent the materials to Wake County Schools and proceeded to initiate the Wake County Virtual Academy without one single offer or word to Johnson. Cooper is a racist, and Dan Forest is no better. They continually rob Black businesses of intellectual property without negotiations or pay. Presently, North Carolina has only 1.3% of the state's receipts and contracts. This is slavery and racism.

I am asking you to Write me in as Governor. I will work tirelessly, as I always have, to bring North Carolina fair and just business opportunities, because I know that business receipts impact our schools, organizations, churches, and communities.
