Hi Steve, I hope you, Aramenta, and your family are doing well. We're hanging in there. I've attached an article I recently published with colleagues. It is a meta-regression analysis about reading achievement and school racial composition using national studies. It shows the negative effects of segregation on reading outcomes, that they increase over time, and that Black children suffer more. It is very technical piece and I don't expect forum readers to dive in. But I want to make it available and part of the larger discussion. It is a companion piece to one we did about segregated school and math outcomes. Same results. If you and organizers of the Forum would be interested, my colleague Martha Bottia and I would like to address the forum and present a "user-friendly" version of our findings.
