



More than 600,000 children will receive additional benefits through the Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) program, NCDHHS announced. P-EBT helps families purchase food for children whose access to free and reduced-priced meals at school has been impacted by remote learning this fall due to COVID-19. The program provides a benefit on an EBT card that can be used to buy food at authorized retailers, including most major grocery stores.

More COVID-19 News

- Governor Cooper announced that North Carolina will move to Phase 3 in the coming <u>days if our COVID-19 key metrics remain stable. That means larger outdoor event venues</u> will be able to open at 7% capacity starting next Friday, Oct. 2. Additional details will be announced soon in a new Executive Order.
- <u>NCDHHS is adding antigen testing information to the COVID-19 NC Dashboard, including</u> positive COVID-19 cases and deaths diagnosed with an antigen test and the number of antigen tests completed daily.
- <u>A new NC Mortgage, Utility and Rent Relief Program will use federal CARES Act funding</u> to direct \$40 million to small businesses hurt by the pandemic.
- NCDHHS announced that North Carolina Medicaid beneficiaries on the NC Innovations
 Waiver who are attending school virtually due to the COVID-19 public health emergency
 can now receive waiver support during remote learning.
