

Rep. Alma Adams Hosts Successful Diversity in Tech Summit

Washington, D.C. – Last week, **Congresswoman Alma Adams** (NC-12) hosted the third annual, and first virtual, Diversity in Tech Summit. The Summit brings together private sector, government, and education leaders to address and ultimately improve the representation of Black Americans and people of color, including women of color, in the tech sector.

"Last week, 47 private partners, HBCU leaders and Members of Congress convened to discuss the importance of HBCUs using technology to create a more just and equitable society," **said Congresswoman Alma Adams (NC-12), founder and Co-Chair of the Congressional Bipartisan HBCU Caucus.** "We convened in the midst of a national emergency where communities of color are most impacted, and HBCU students, faculty, staff and their communities have been particularly hard hit. I applaud all of our private partners for working with us create 21st century opportunity for the institutions and students who need our help the most."
