- Adams joined members of the NC delegation to urge Facebook to stop misleading political ads on both sides.

## **Trump Administration**

- Adams <u>opposed Amy Coney Barrett's nomination</u> to the Supreme Court, stating "There is nothing in this appointment for the vast majority of Americans except for pain and suffering."
- Adams <u>expressed concern</u> with the Trump Administration's decision to end the census count early.
- Adams <u>called on the Department of Labor</u> to stop a proposed rule that would harm women in the workplace.

• Adams hosted a <u>Military Service Academy Day</u> for prospective officers.
