Quit and Stay Quit Monday

Mecklenburg County is joining the Monday quitters movement—quitting smoking, vaping, and other tobacco use. Quit and Stay Quit Monday is a tool designed to encourage tobacco users to quit or recommit to quitting every Monday.

Beginning Monday, Nov. 16—in conjunction with the Great American Smokeout this week—Mecklenburg County will share the campaign's inspirational Monday messages with all County employees, encouraging them to put tobacco down forever. Mecklenburg County will also promote *Quit and Stay Quit Monday* to the community at-large through social media and other channels, including <u>TobaccoFree.MeckNC.gov</u>.

There's never a better time to quit, as cigarette smoking and vaping increases the risk of severe illness from COVID-19. Anyone can call 1-800-Quit-Now for free quit coaching and if eligible, free nicotine replacement therapy.

The 12-week Quit and Stay Quit Monday campaign is spearheaded by the Mecklenburg County Public Health, Human Resources, and Public Information departments.
