

Over the past nine months, we've witnessed Charlotte's Black businesses and residents adapt to realities triggered by the coronavirus pandemic. In the new year, I'll be dedicating more of my work to stories and projects that amplify the city's Black business ecosystem.

What does that mean? Starting Jan. 1, I'll move from managing editor to become a senior writer for QCity Metro.

I kept thinking about stories I wanted to explore but couldn't because of other duties that gobbled up my time and attention. In October, we began shifting my role so I could take away that excuse.

I've enjoyed leading our efforts the last two-plus years to center Charlotte's Black community.




Trinity Episcopal School asked its community to participate in their 21 Day Equity Challenge.
