Since my email to you at the end of December, an opportunity has presented itself that I could not ignore. One week from now, the Council will appoint someone to finish the remainder of Councilman James "Smuggie" Mitchell's current term. His departure, announced two weeks ago, means there will be an open At-Large seat in this fall's election. After talking with my family and campaign team, I have made the decision to pursue that vacancy.

Serving as the District 1 representative for the last two terms has been an incredible honor and privilege. I have been able to get to better know the people and communities of my district at a grassroots level and have learned an immense amount about how local government can and should serve its citizens.
