Food and Nutrition Services Recipients to Receive Temporary Benefits Increase

Mecklenburg County Department of Social Services Food and Nutrition Services recipients will see a temporary increase in the amount of benefits they receive. The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services announced that this increase is part of the federal Emergency Coronavirus Relief Act of 2020.

The maximum benefit amount for FNS recipients will increase by 15% until June 30, 2021. After June 30, 2021, benefit amounts will return to the previous levels. Recipients can find out the amount of their benefits by using one of the following methods:

- Visit www.ebtedge.com. Click "More Information" under "EBT Cardholder." You will be prompted to login and/or register your account.
- Download the ebtEDGE mobile app. The app is available as a free download on the Apple Store and Google Play.
- Call 1-888-622-7328 on the day you normally receive benefits.

Food and Nutrition Services is a food assistance program that helps low-income families with purchasing food. Benefits are issued via Electronic Benefit Transfer cards (EBT cards). Since the pandemic began, the County has seen an increase in FNS applications as well as expedite requests. Staff will continue to align resources to meet the increase in demand for this service.
