Join us as we delve into the community dimensions of criminal justice system impacts and how to take action.

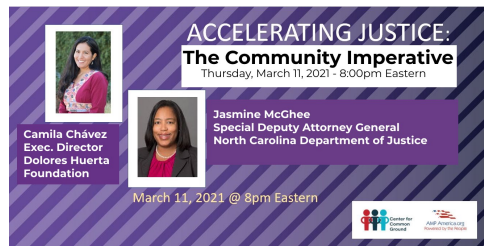
Jasmine McGhee, North Carolina Special Deputy Attorney General,
