Energy Bill Assistance Applications Accepted Through March 31

There is less than two weeks left for County residents to apply for help with their home heating costs.

The application window for LIEAP funds closes on March 31.

LIEAP (Low-Income Energy Assistance Program) is a federally-funded program that provides for one-time payment to help eligible households pay their heating bills.

Individuals can submit applications via email, mail, or drop-off. Completed applications can be:
