### NCDHHS Monitoring Wastewater to Detect Spread of COVID-19

NCDHHS today <u>expanded</u> its <u>NC COVID-19 Dashboard</u> to include a new metric – <u>wastewater monitoring</u>. Since January 2021, NCDHHS has been testing wastewater samples to look for SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, as part of the <u>CDC's National Wastewater Surveillance System</u>.

This new statewide program is a collaboration between 11 wastewater utilities, 8 local public health departments and researchers at the University of North Carolina.

People who are infected with COVID-19 shed viral particles in their feces. This can be measured in wastewater if enough people are infected. Currently, data are reported from 11 wastewater treatment facilities in North Carolina, but the program is expanding to additional sites.

"Wastewater monitoring is a new tool that will help us track the spread of COVID-19 in participating communities even as fewer people are being tested," said State Epidemiologist Dr. Zack Moore. "This can be an early warning system and allow health officials to take actions to stop the spread if trends are increasing."
