Mecklenburg Board of County Commissioners Encourages Residents to Apply for the 2023 Citizens Revaluation Advisory Committee

The Mecklenburg County Clerk's Office in collaboration with the County Tax Assessor's Office is accepting applications from residents who are interested in serving on the 2023 Citizens Revaluation Advisory Committee.

The Committee is tasked with the responsibility of meeting with the [County Assessor](#), along with County management and staff, to review the overall operations and statistical reports related to the County's 2023 Revaluation. In addition, the Committee will be responsible for reporting updates and conclusions to the Board of County Commissioners. The deadline to apply is Nov. 30, 2021.

County's Criminal Justice Services Department is Offering Funding for Programs that Serve At-Risk Youth

The Criminal Justice Services Department's Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) is now accepting applications for funding of programs that serve at risk and delinquent youth in Mecklenburg County.

Local public agencies, 501(c)3 non-profits, and local housing authorities are encouraged to submit proposals for a community-based residential program that will serve delinquent youth ages 6 to 17 who are either under the supervision of juvenile court, lacking supervision, or are exhibiting behavior that will place them at a high risk for juvenile court involvement.

Approximately \$202,000 in anticipated allocation will be available for fiscal year 2021-2022 (February 1, 2022 - June 30, 2022). Grants will be awarded to organizations that provide services consistent with the Mecklenburg County JCPC annual plan. All interested applicants are required to attend a Pre-Bid Information session before applying for funds.
