Redistricting Update



The North Carolina Supreme Court heard oral arguments this week in the three combined cases challenging the district maps enacted by the NC General Assembly. The trial included **discussion and debate on the permissibility of partisanship, the role of the North Carolina constitution, the disenfranchisement of Democratic voters, and more.** We expect the Court to issue its opinion soon. The **Social Justice Committee of the Davidson College Presbyterian Church invited me to be part of the panel to discuss gun violence** last week. I was honored to join the other panelists: Davidson Police Chief Penny Dunn, CMS Board Chair Elyse Dashew, and Acquanetta Edmond, the Community Superintendent for the NW Learning Community for CMS.

We discussed the **need for background checks on all gun sales, the importance of safe**

storage of firearms, the status of gun safety legislation in NC, the work CMS is doing to protect students, and the need for solutions that are mindful of mental health considerations. We took questions from in-person and online audience members.

Meeting with the Principals

I was invited to share my thoughts about education policy and answer the principals' questions on various topics: retention, incentives, teacher and principal pay, the importance of calendar flexibility, and investments required by *Leandro*. I was joined by Sen. Carl Ford (R-Rowan). It is important that we have educators at the table when education policy is made. I appreciated this opportunity to speak with and listen to educators in NC public schools.

Expanded Medication Access in North Carolina



Starting February 1st, people in NC will be able to get birth control pills and patches, prenatal vitamins, HIV prevention medication, glucagon to treat hypoglycemia and nicotine replacement therapy from a pharmacist without a prescription. This is one of those examples when Republicans and Democrats in Raleigh agreed and made life better for North Carolinians. I was proud to [vote for this bipartisan bill](#) during the Long Session. Homeowner Assistance Fund Application





- **First Baptist Church of Cornelius, 21007 Catawba Ave, Cornelius. Monday, Tuesday and Thursday 9 a.m. – 4 p.m.**
- **R.C. Bradford Park, 17005 Davidson-Concord Rd, Huntersville. Monday - Friday 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.**


