New Charlotte Resident Wins BlkTech Interactive's First HBCU Social Impact Hackathon/Startup Weekend

CHARLOTTE, NC (March 31, 2022) - BlkTech Interactive hosted their first HBCU Social Impact Hackathon built by Lowes on March 25 - 29. Two dozen individuals from HBCUs that included—Alabama A&M, Grambling, Fisk University, Florida A&M, Johnson C. Smith, Morgan State, North Carolina Central University Fab Lab, other institutions— Bowdoin College, Central Piedmont Community College, Cornell University, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, and University of Michigan and general community members from around the county registered to spend the weekend working in teams to design and develop innovative tech solutions to address the challenges of access to fresh food, education, or community violence.

Five teams were created on Friday evening after a lively fireside chat with Malcolm Xavier Evans.

On Tuesday, March 29, three finalists presented their pitches to a judging panel of five.

The event will be held at UNC-Charlotte and virtually. The first-place winner will receive \$5,000, mentoring to pitch and submit for larger national challenges and increase social capital with access to internships and employment with Lowes Home Improvement and other corporate partners.

"I am amazed at the resilience of our winners and the participants, says Rashaan Peek, director of BlkTech Interactive. She continued, "These teams were up at 9 am on a Sunday morning learning how to pitch from Henry Rocks [executive director of City Startup Labs]. They really wanted it."

The next HBCU Social Impact Hackathon is scheduled for November 11-15, 2022, to coincide with World Entrepreneurship Week.
