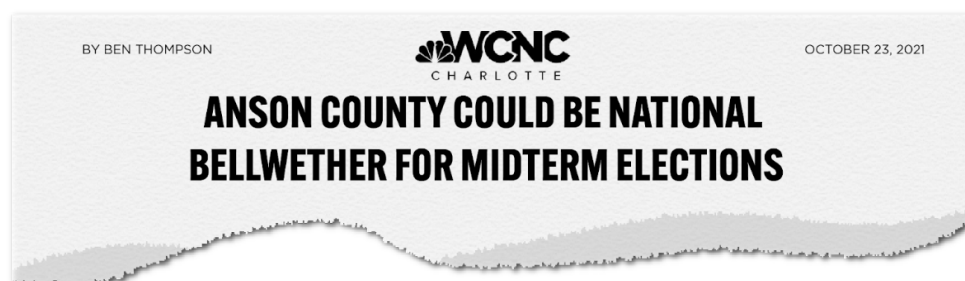

Tune in to MSNBC's Meet The Press Daily on Thursday, April 28 at 1:00 pm EST to see Chuck Todd's coverage of Anson County, North Carolina, and the work the New Rural Project and others are doing to engage voters of color who have felt left behind and become disengaged from the electoral process. Last year we shared with you that Anson County has been named one of NBC's seven 'bellwether' counties in the nation and is also one of the New Rural Project's focus counties.



MSNBC reporter Antonia Hylton has been working in Anson County since late 2021 reporting on the sentiments of Anson County's disengaged voters of color and listening to what issues concern them, whether they think voting could solve their issues, and what impact that might have on whether they turn out to vote in November. We were honored that Ms. Hylton followed the New Rural Project and our volunteers on March 20th in Anson County as we had our "Front

Porch Conversations" with rural voters. Highlights of her time with us will be a part of MSNBC's reporting on organizations that are working to increase voter turnout in rural communities that have large numbers of voters of color. **I am thrilled that through this reporting, we are amplifying the voices of the infrequent voters in Anson County.**

All citizens deserve to have their voices heard, which is why we must work to eliminate barriers to voting for rural folks, especially for young and historically marginalized voters. We're more excited than ever about the impact of our work, and we're proud and grateful to have you with us.
