## CMS wants to hear from residents to help select their next Superintendent

CHARLOTTE (September 26, 2022) - The **Charlotte-Mecklenburg School Board** wants to know what parents and community members are looking for in a new Superintendent. The school board is working with Charlotte-based consulting firm **Civility Localized** to conduct community engagement from September 26 to December 13, 2022. Gathering community input in an authentic and inclusive manner is critical for the school board superintendent search process.

According to Christine Edwards, Founder of Civility Localized, "The goal is to gain as many perspectives as possible. We value the lived experiences of each participant and hope to illuminate the needs and priorities of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg community in an authentic way."
