With only 11 days until Election Day, the pressure is on! The New Rural Project team is working at full capacity, door knocking six days a week, phone banking, and texting to have critical conversations with infrequent voters about how important it is this year to cast their ballot. We explain North Carolina's 'One Stop Early Voting,' a more than two-week period from Thursday, October 20th through Saturday, November 5th at 3:00 PM during which residents can register and vote on the same day.
