To hear 42-year-old Angel Boone talk about her life today, one would not know that she spent years struggling with addiction. At 10, she was removed from her family because of drugs in the home.

After unsuccessful serial placements in group and foster homes, Angel petitioned for and received a court-ordered Emancipation when she was 15. "Foster care didn't work for me," said Boone.




