Grants Available Soon: Foundation For Black Philanthropy Accepting Applications from Nonprofits

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Foundation For Black Philanthropy will begin accepting applications for its 2023 grant program on Tuesday, February 28. Eligible organizations include 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations, churches, religious organizations, governmental agencies, and educational institutions.

Grants will be awarded in support of education, health, and economic development. Priority will be given to projects and programs addressing societal disparities experienced by African Americans. All proposed projects and programs must serve residents of Charlotte-Mecklenburg County.

Award amounts will be determined based on the merits of the project. Previous awards have ranged from \$1,000 to \$10,000.

To begin the application process, visit ftcgrants.communityforce.com and select "Foundation For Black Philanthropy" to access the online application. Returning applicant organizations can log in to the Online Grants Center using their previously established ID and password. First-time applicant organizations can create a new account. **Completed applications must be submitted online by noon on Friday, March 31.** The online application closes promptly at 12 p.m. and will not accept late submissions.
