The Black Political Caucus of Charlotte-Mecklenburg is profoundly troubled and dismayed by the recent changes in values and priorities exhibited by Representative Tricia Cotham. As an organization dedicated to protecting and advancing the interests of the Black community and ensuring our voices are heard and respected, we will not remain silent in the face of such a critical development.

When we endorsed Rep. Cotham, we did so based on her commitment to fighting for women's rights, the right to vote, and the protection of African American rights. These values align with our mission and the aspirations of our community. However, her recent decisions raise significant concerns about her dedication to these essential principles.

Our endorsement of Rep. Cotham was a reflection of our belief in her ability to not only represent but also uplift the Black community. Regrettably, her shift in values appears to align her more closely with a political faction with a troubling history of policies and rhetoric aimed at suppressing the voices of marginalized groups, including African Americans and women. We must remain vigilant in holding our elected officials accountable for their actions, ensuring that they remain true to the promises they made during their campaigns. The Black Political Caucus remains steadfast in our commitment to endorsing candidates who genuinely represent the interests of our community and who will work tirelessly to advance the causes that matter most to us.
