


Our Executive Director, Patrice Funderburg, shares what you can expect the day of our fundraiser and what it means for Charlotte.






More good news! CCT was nominated and awarded a Starbucks Foundation Neighborhood Grants to continue our efforts to help those transitioning from incarceration back into society.


Father's Day
