Caregiver TLC Updates and Publication

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Hello all,

Thank you again for your continued support of the Caregiver TLC Program.

We would like to share the news about the efficacy of the Caregiver Thrive, Learn & Connect psychoeducational program (CaregiverTLC) funded by The Southminster Community Fund.

Results from the data collected over the last two years support the efficacy of the CaregiverTLC online program to significantly reduce depressive scores (d =.52) and improve self-efficacy levels (d =.51) among caregivers attending the program in comparison to caregivers in the waitlist control condition. In addition, caregivers in the intervention group reported significant reductions in levels of burden (d = .30) and anxiety (d=.29) as well as improvement in perceived positive aspects of caregiving (d = .27) compared to those in the wait list control condition. Findings also provide support for effective use of this program with caregivers of both White and Black racial/ethnic backgrounds, as well as with caregivers caring for a person with chronic health conditions or neurocognitive disorders, such as dementia. The findings were just published in the Journal of Clinical Gerontologist.
