ULCC's workforce development program is a vital initiative aimed at building diverse talent pipelines for the business community. We are committed to breaking down barriers that prevent underrepresented populations from accessing the resources and training needed to succeed in the workforce. Through our programs, we provide job readiness training, career coaching, and placement assistance to equip individuals with the skills and support necessary to thrive in today's job market. We believe that by investing in our community's talent, we can create a more equitable and prosperous future for all.

OUR FOCUS

Women in Trades (and Beyond)

These iniatives are aimed at equipping women with the necessary skills to pursue and excel in traditionally male-dominated industries such as construction, engineering, and manufacturing. through barriers and thrive in these fields.

HVAC (Heating Ventilation & Air Conditioning)

This 13-week certification program is focused on the knowledge and hands-on skills needed to be ready for certification and immediate entry-level employment.

Electrical

This 12-week program prepares students for careers in the trades as an electrician.

Certified Nursing Assistant

The Nursing Aide 1 Program is a one hundred and twelve (112) hours NC State approved training course which provides the core knowledge and skills necessary to provide quality health care

Medical Coding

This 5-week course is designed for anyone who is preparing for a career in medical coding with little to no work experience in the field.





SITUATION

The US is experiencing the greatest learning loss in the history of education.

25% and 30% of kids are at math and reading grade-level. The lowest it has been in the past 30-years

\$150B+ Negative effect on GDP by 2040 if learning loss isn't addressed

OPPORTUNITY

Pearl + NSSA + ULCC = High Impact Tutoring

Pearl and the NSSA (*National Student Support Accelerator*) are developing a standard model to help ULCC work with local HBCU's to provide evidence-based tutoring support to the highest need districts.

The Effects of Stereotypes

17 Million Whites reported having used an illicit drug

within the last month

4 Million

Blacks reported having used an illicit drug within the last month

Although African Americans make up only **12.5%** of illicit drug users, **33%** of drug incarcerations are black. This leads to major roadblocks in treatments for substance abuse among the population, as there is a fear in self-reporting.¹








North Carolina's Black maternal mortality (52.8) rate is, more than three times the (17.3) rate for white mothers. It was nearly five times higher than the rate of (10.7) for Hispanic mothers.

HOUSING

Participants.

Over 77% of all homeowners served by Restore Our Homes reported loss of income and employment as their primary reason for default, followed by medical issues, both of which are the most difficult circumstances to resolve.

Restore Our Homes provides home retention and loss mitigation counseling as well as client outreach services. 
