Historical Notes: North Carolina ABSE, a state affiliate of The North Carolina Alliance of Black School Educators (NABSE) is the nation's largest premier non-profit organization devoted to furthering the academic success for all the nation's children, particularly children of African descent. Now in its 52nd year, NABSE boasts an outreach to more than 8,000 preeminent educators including teachers, administrators, superintendents as well as corporate

and institutional members.

North Carolina Alliance of Black School Educators was founded in 2012 after Dr. Gray asked the question, how are AA children faring in NC? After data collection, Dr. Gray found over 70 percent of AA children were not reading at third grade level and over 15,000 AA male students had been suspended compared to white boys. Several months later, NABSE's work began by organizing six affiliates with a total of seven to date including The Greater Charlotte ABSE organized in 1994.

We are hopeful that NCABSE will host an annual conference to continue offering professional development activities to School Districts throughout NC in Equity, Literacy, STEM, STEAM, Financial Literacy. Affiliates also offer workshops, conferences and town hall meetings for school leaders and educators, students, parents, and community.
