FIVE COMMUNITY LEADERS HONORED AT 6TH ANNUAL WOMEN'S HEALTH & DOCTOR RECOGNITION LUNCHEON

CHARLOTTE, NC, March 19, 2024 – More than 300 guests gathered on Thursday, March 7, 2024 at the Hilton Uptown Charlotte hotel to honor and celebrate the achievements of five outstanding community leaders. Hosted by The C.W. Williams Community Health Center, Inc. (CWWCHC), the 6th Annual Women's Health & Doctor Recognition luncheon paid homage to Dr. Alma Adams, United States Congresswoman; Erica Bryant, Emmy Award Winning Journalist and WSOC-TV News Co-Anchor; Rodney Gaddy, Retired Executive Director, ONE Charlotte Health Alliance; David Jacobs, MD, Trauma & Acute Care Surgeon and Vice-Chair of Diversity, Equity & Inclusion, Atrium Health; and John Selden, DDS, founder and owner of Inspired Dentistry of Charlotte.

The concept to host an event honoring minority community and civic leaders was conceived by CWWCHC's Chief Executive Officer, Debra Weeks. "It is gratifying to see the wide range of support shown at our annual luncheon to promote health and wellbeing, while paying homage to trailblazers who define what it means to be a community champion, change agent, and servant leader," said Debra Weeks.
