- Proof of Mecklenburg County residency (photo ID or current utility bill or signed lease agreement)
- Proof of all household income (4 weeks of pay stubs and/or SSI award letter and/or Snap benefits award letter and/or Child Support documentation and/or current 1040 tax return [signed])
- Provide copy of vendor information (i.e., summer camp registration, 1-2 price quotes or invoices)
- Someone in the household must have an intellectual/developmental disability diagnosis (i.e., Autism, Down Syndrome, Cerebral Palsy or Traumatic Brain Injury)
