2024 General Election Season Is Here!

This month, more than 100 members of the League of Women Voters of Charlotte Mecklenburg have signed on to the Voter Services Team. These vital volunteers have been working hard across the county at farmer's markets, libraries, college campuses, festivals, and more to register voters and provide resources and information.

In addition to the daily opportunities for members to get out into the community to volunteer at voter registration tables, the League will participate in a big push on National Voter Registration Day, September 17. Plans are set for at least a half a dozen sites around the county that day.

League members were also encouraged to recruit poll workers for the Mecklenburg County Board of Elections last month. That effort continues as there is still a need to staff the 33 sites chosen for Early Voting from October 17 thru November 2 and 243 polling locations on Election Day. If you are interest-



This one-night only event includes delicious conversation after the show and cake for all.



Why is this important?

During the past year, the Public Education Team held listening sessions across the state. From League members we learned about the importance of the public schools to the students, families and businesses in their communities and about the dedication of teachers and staff. However, there were concerns shared by all areas: teacher shortages, insufficient funding, and eroding public support of schools.

We learned that 70% of NC residents do not have school age children and so are not connected with the schools. With North Carolina being one of the fastest growing states, many newcomers are not aware of how our public education systems operate.

What is our goal?

Our goal is to engage as many North Carolinians as possible so that they will make informed decisions when they vote. We all need to be reminded that Public Schools are the bedrock of North Carolina's success. The public schools educate our future workforce, strengthen our communities, and fuel our economy. Voters need to be encouraged to vote down the ballot in state and local elections.

Education Team Pushes for Teacher Pay Raises

The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Board of Education passed a resolution and started a petition to demonstrate public support for adjusting the proposed state budget to include at a minimum a 5% increase for teachers—and all educational staff. The LWVCM Education Team endorses this petition.

Currently, the budget calls for a pay raise of only 3%. When considered with inflation, this ostensibly amounts to a pay cut.

Please consider signing the petition, and asking your family members, neighbors, and friends who live in North Carolina to sign as well and pass it on to their circles. Currently, there are 1,689 signatures with a goal of 10,000. Click this link to access the petition.

NC Trusted Elections Tour Stops Off in Charlotte

As part of a 28 event tour spanning the state from Murphy in the west to Manteo in the east, the North Carolina Network for Fair, Safe, and Secure Elections came to Charlotte on August 27 to engage voters at Queens University. More than 100 attendees heard from tour hosts Former Mayor of Charlotte Jennifer Roberts and Former North Carolina Supreme Court Justice Robert Orr. Charlotte journalist Dedrick Russell served as moderator of a panel discussion sparked by audience questions. The panelists were Mecklenburg County Board of Elections Director Michael Dickerson, Board members John Gresham (D) and Liz McDowell (R), attorney Zach Deason, and cybersecurity expert Torry Crass.

LWVCM Co-President Linda Traum and Vice President Debora Arnold (right) were on hand to register voters and answer questions. Several students received guidance about Absentee by Mail voting.

With summer fading into fall, our newly elected LWVCM Board met for the first time in August and is enthusiastically taking the lead on our top priority: the Get Out the Vote (GOTV) effort. We encourage everyone to zoom into the **ALL MEMBERS CALL** on September 3 at 7 p.m. for vital election information and tools supporting our grassroots work. You may register here.

Women's votes (especially younger women's) could well determine the outcome of November's election and thus, the direction of our country, state and county. U.S. Census Bureau statistics reveal women's voting registrations surpass that of men's by as high as 10% points in recent years. Women's votes wield immense power in our elections, giving them the opportunity to determine issues directly impacting their welfare. Accordingly, we should do all we can, whenever we can, to assure their voices are heard!

Linda and her volunteers registered and updated registrations for an impressive number of citizens in our booth at Charlotte PRIDE and distributed information to hundreds. Plans are underway to mark <u>National Voter Registration Day</u> on September 17 with a League presence at least six area libraries. Women's Equality Day was celebrated with a <u>video on the history of women's suffrage</u> narrated by Suzanne who will also represent LWVCM as a panelist on the September "Seeking Unity" program to air on WTVI-PB. Participants will explore strategies to counter political polarization and disunity.

One of our top priorities for the coming year is fundraising with an anticipated fall launch. Funds are needed to support on-going League projects including ambitious and invigorated voter registration; GOTV; VOTE411; Public Education advocacy; a candidate Meet & Greet; "Makin' Cake" stage production at Queens; Civics101 and other league expenses. In addition to our members we will be approaching local corporate sources for needed supportive funding. League members are passionate about encouraging informed and active participation in government-as we defend against voter suppression, misinformation regarding voting laws, and citizen's rights. Let's back this commitment with our dollars!!
