NCCAA Recognizes Leadership During Hurricane Helene

Few challenges are more daunting in the Community Action world than natural disasters, particularly on the scale of the destruction wrought by Hurricane Helene during the waning days of September.

Helene's flooding caused at least 103 deaths in North Carolina and \$53 billion in damages and recovery needs. The storm and its aftermath caused 1,400 landslides and damaged over 160 water and sewer systems, at least 6,000 miles of roads, more than 1,000 bridges and culverts and an estimated 126,000 homes. Some 220,000 households are expected to apply for federal assistance.

We honor the leadership, staff and volunteers at each of our member organizations principally affected by the storm, and the extraordinary work they've done since. Our hearts are with those who have suffered. And we look forward to both acknowledging their efforts and learning from their experiences moving forward.



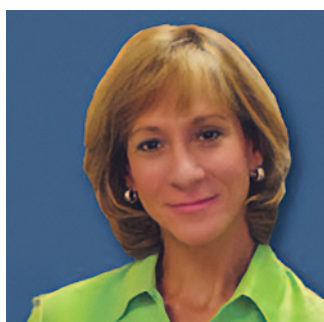

Motivated HEAL NC Participant Takes Full Advantage

After spending just a few minutes with Anali Ortiz-Martinez, you will feel energized. Her smile and positive attitude are contagious. Anali is a HEAL NC participant at the Carver Head Start Center in Mount Olive. HEAL NC is a pilot project in Wayne County that provides intensive support to Head Start families. The partnership with WAGES (Wayne Action Group for Economic Solvency) is funded by The Duke Endowment.

While Anali's childhood was devoid of family support, she is determined to do things differently now that she is a parent.

"What keeps me motivated is the new opportunity to live, to make things right, and the precious opportunity to heal through this amazing program made for us," she said. "My goal is to be able to offer a bright future to my son, knowing that if mommy is ok and stable, so will he."

Anali is eager to learn during HEAL NC's monthly Parent Engagement Meetings. She is always willing to lend a helping hand, and she does not let many things stand in the way of her achieving her goals. She meets with her Success Coach consistently and has attended every HEAL NC meeting – all while working two jobs.

"I have learned so much from this program, the importance of identifying and channeling emotions. It has been very beneficial having someone to guide me through the process.

The activities that we have at HEAL NC are so comforting that I feel excited to be there all the time, to participate and share experiences with each other. This program is an amazing help, and I am beyond grateful besides the financial help, I am grateful for this resource ... My 2024 has been full of blessings, and HEAL NC is one of them."

Persons named to The Order become honorary North Carolina "Ambassadors" with their names and award dates recorded on a Roster maintained by The Order of the Long Leaf Pine Society.



WAMY Changes Drive Focus

WAMY Community Action is shifting the focus of the 'Santa for Seniors' gift drive to rebuilding homes for seniors. For five years, this program has brought joy to seniors in the High Country with nearly 5,000 gifts. In 2024, the focus will shift to addressing urgent community needs, moving from physical gifts to monetary donations.

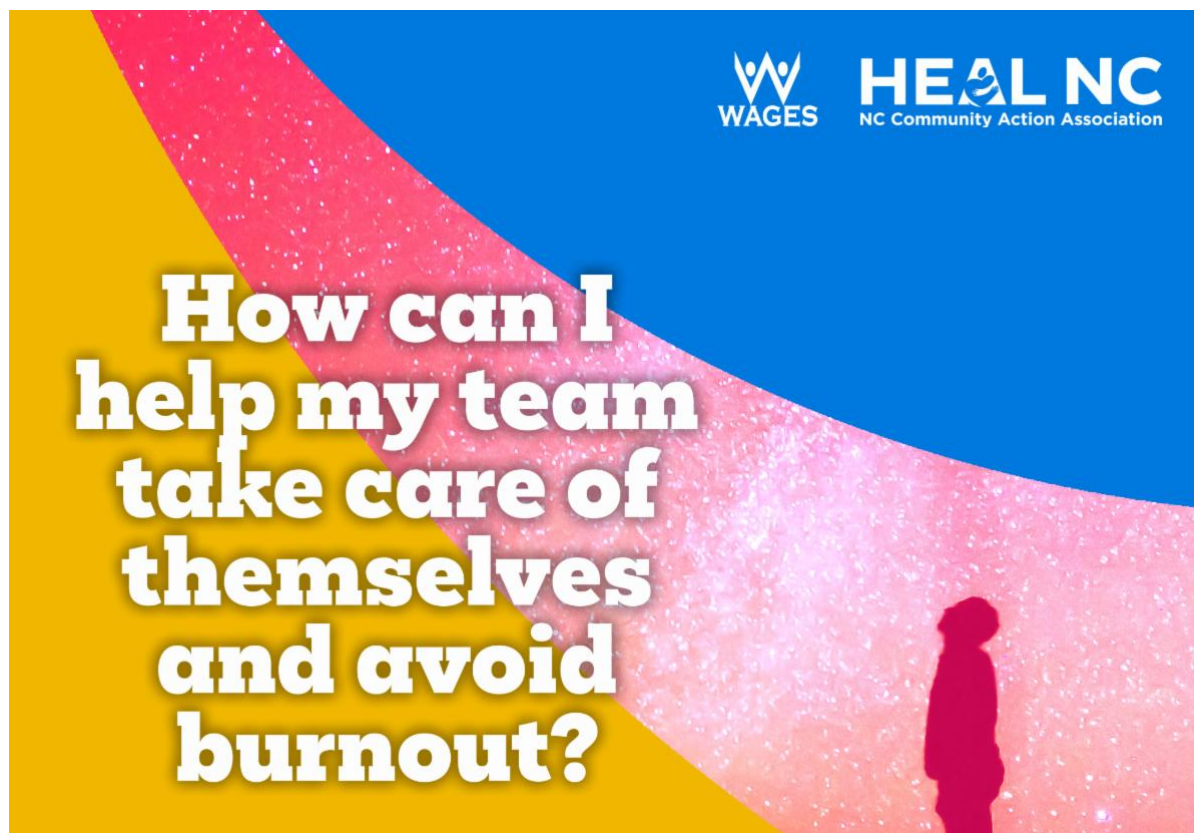
Toolkit Available Online
