Clerk's Office Seeks Volunteers to Serve on Nursing Home and Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committees

The Nursing Home Advisory Committee is charged with promoting and protecting the rights of residents living in adult care homes and nursing facilities through regular visitation to long-term care facilities in the County.

The Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee promotes the interests and well-being of residents in adult care homes and only requires members to commit an average of eight hours a month.

County to Reveal Design for Latta Place at Upcoming Community Meeting

Mecklenburg County has reached a new milestone ahead of the reopening of historic [Latta Place](https://LattaPlace.com). The County will reveal the final design for the site at a community meeting on Thursday, March 20, from 5:30-7:30 p.m. in Community Rooms A and B, at the North County Regional Library in Huntersville ([16500 Holly Crest Lane](https://16500HollyCrestLane.com)). The design concept will illustrate the County's envisioned updates to the landscape and built environment of Latta Place.

The design concept is built on years of resident input, historical research and analyses, and thoughtful discussions about how the Mecklenburg County community acknowledges and shares its history. The County anticipates Latta Place will reopen to the public in 2026.

Residents are encouraged to attend the meeting where they will see the design and site plans for the first time, hear about the robust community engagement and planning processes, and learn about the future of the project. Department of Community Resources Continues to Accept Applications for Low-Income Energy Assistance Program

The Mecklenburg County Department of Community Resources ([DCR](#)), through its Low-Income Energy Assistance Program ([LIEAP](#)), is still accepting applications from residents having trouble paying their heating bills. LIEAP is one of several programs administered by DCR to help low-income households with their immediate energy needs, so they do not need to choose between heating their homes and other basic needs.

LIEAP applicants do not have to be at risk of disconnection or delinquent to take advantage of this one-time, direct vendor payment in the amount of \$300, \$400, or \$500 based on their primary heating source. Assistance is available for all eligible applicants until March 31, 2025, or until funds run out. Solid Waste Division is Accepting Food Scraps and Solar Panels for Recycling

Mecklenburg County Solid Waste is now accepting residential food scraps for composting. Residents can bring food scraps to the Hickory Grove ([8007 Pence Road](#)) or Compost Central ([140 Valleydale Road](#)) facility.

In addition, the County is accepting solar panels as part of its enhanced recycling program. Residents and businesses can drop off up to 10 panels at Compost Central. If a resident or business has more than 10 panels, they're asked to email SolidWaste@MeckNC.gov prior to visiting the recycling location.
