Clerk's Office Encourages Residents to Apply for Juvenile Crime Prevention Council Advisory Board

The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council ([JCPC](#)) is a statutorily authorized County advisory board charged with reviewing the needs of juveniles who are delinquent or at risk of becoming court involved. In particular, the Clerk is searching for someone to serve in the Juvenile Defense Attorney slot (must be under the age of 21), and a Business Community representative.

JCPC's ongoing mission is to address the gaps in youth services by promoting prevention, intervention, treatment, and aftercare strategies and programs that strengthen families and support community safety. Members can serve up to two (two-year) terms.

Homeowners Encouraged to Apply for Economic Assistance Grant through HOMES Program

HOMES (Helping Out Mecklenburg's homeowners with Economic Support) provides economic assistance grants of up to \$650 to qualifying Mecklenburg County homeowners. Residents within the Town of Davidson could qualify for an additional grant of up to \$534.

Mecklenburg County homeowners who may qualify for a HOMES grant are those who have lived in their home for at least the last three years (it is their primary residence), have no more than one delinquent tax bill in the last three years, and meet a qualifying total household income level.

County Earns Highest Recognition for Government Financial Reporting

For the 50th consecutive year, Mecklenburg County has earned the highest recognition in governmental accounting and financial reporting. [The Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada](#) announced it has awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting to Mecklenburg County for the County's [Annual Comprehensive Financial Report for the Fiscal Year that ended June 30, 2024](#).

The [Mecklenburg County Financial Services Department](#) completes the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report after each fiscal year to communicate the financial health of the County, and to comply with State of North Carolina requirements. County's Solid Waste Division Recognized for Pollution Prevention Efforts

Mecklenburg County's [Solid Waste](#) Division was recently recognized by Charlotte Water for the agency's pollution prevention efforts at the Foxhole landfill, which is primarily used for business and commercial disposal.

The County's Solid Waste team was honored with its first ever Crown Award, presented for overall excellence for a large-scale industrial discharge system. The team also won a Platinum Award, which recognizes 100 percent compliance for preventing discharges to the sewer system from the Foxhole Landfill for at least five consecutive years. These achievements follow on the heels of Solid Waste also being recognized with a [NCDEQ award](#), as well as recently opening a [new materials recycling facility](#).
