Clerk's Office Seeks Applicants to Fill Vacancies on the County's Capital Budget Advisory Committee

Members of the Citizens Capital Budget Advisory Committee are charged with receiving and reviewing capital project forms, project reports, and reporting to the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) annually on findings related to capital, deferred maintenance, and operating costs. In addition, the committee is responsible for reviewing the community engagement process for the Capital Improvement Program.

BOCC to Hold Public Hearing on PAVE Act and Vote on the Transit Referendum , In Addition to Voting to Reconstitute Lake Norman Marine Commission on Aug. 6

The Board of County Commissioners will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, Aug. 6, 2025, to receive public input related to Public Access to Valuable Equity (P.A.V.E.) Act and the proposed 1-cent sales tax increase referendum for local and regional transportation projects.

The hearing will be held during the Board's 6 p.m. meeting in the chamber of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center, and members of the public are invited to attend in person or virtually. Following the public hearing, the Board will conduct a vote on whether to place the proposed 1-cent sales tax increase referendum on the November ballot.

The Board is also slated to discuss and vote on the joint resolution to Reconstitute the Lake Norman Marine Commission.

Mecklenburg County and the City of Charlotte are collaborating to develop the Comprehensive Plan for Unincorporated South Mecklenburg (CPUSM). This initiative aims to provide land use guidance for the unincorporated area of south Mecklenburg County, bordered by Lancaster Highway, Providence Road West, the town limits of Pineville, and the South Carolina border. Permits Available for Local Food Vendors via County's Food and Facilities Sanitation Program

[Mecklenburg County's Food and Facilities Sanitation Program](#) (F&FS), a mandated program administered by the County's Public Health Department, through its Environmental Health Services division, continues to encourage food vendors to apply for permits.

F&FS issues permits to more than 4,400 food service facilities operating in Mecklenburg County and conducts more than 13,000 facility inspections per year. The program provides services and resources to numerous vendors including food service operators, mobile food units, pushcarts, shared use kitchens, and both limited and temporary food establishments.
