Committee members are charged with reviewing and recommending storm water management policies, policy changes, long-range plans, and their budgetary and rate impacts. In addition, participants hear appeals and reach decisions on service charges, credits, and adjustments. SWAC is looking to fill its financial, accounting, and legal profession vacancies.

Mecklenburg County Welcomes New Deputy County Managers



Dr. Kimm Campbell (pictured left) has joined Mecklenburg County as deputy county manager for the combined Health and Human Services agency, which includes the Office of Housing and Community Development, along with the departments of [Child, Family, and Adult Services](#), [Public Health](#), [Community Resources](#), and [Community Support Services](#). Dr. Campbell has more than 30 years of experience in state and local government, as well as nonprofit organizations, most recently serving as the deputy county administrator of Broward County, Florida. As Broward County's deputy county administrator, Dr. Campbell was responsible for the general management of county government operations with an \$8 billion budget and more than 7,000 employees in a community of more than two million residents.

Michelle L. Attreed (pictured right) joins the County as deputy county manager for financial services and will have oversight of the County's [Finance Department](#), the [Tax Collector's Office](#), [Information Technology Services](#), [Human Resources](#), and the [Assessor's Office](#). She brings with her more than 30 years of public service experience and recently served as acting deputy county executive for government operations, performance, and innovation for Prince William County, Virginia. Attreed also served more than 11 years as Prince William County's chief financial officer (CFO) and provided fiscal stewardship and accountability for more than \$2 billion in public funds.

Department of Community Resources Awards Over \$1 Million in Economic Assistance Grants through HOMES Program



Mecklenburg County's HOMES (Helping Out Mecklenburg's homeowners with Economic Support) program provides economic assistance grants of up to \$650 to qualifying Mecklenburg County homeowners. Residents within the Town of Davidson could qualify for an additional grant of up to \$534.

Since opening the application period on July 1, nearly 2,000 homeowners have been awarded economic assistance grants and funds are still available through Nov. 21, 2025.

Administered through Public Health's Population Health division, this initiative is one of several programs the County funds to support and promote healthy lifestyles and behavior. Mecklenburg County continues to collaborate with other community organizations to offer lactation pods and makeover other private spaces for breastfeeding or pumping purposes.
