Rep. Adams Announces Full November SNAP Benefits for Her Constituents

CHARLOTTE, NC—Today, **Congresswoman Alma S. Adams, Ph.D. (NC-12), Senior Member of the House Agriculture Committee,** announced North Carolina SNAP recipients will receive their full November SNAP benefits after previously being told by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) that they would only administer partial SNAP benefits this month.

This announcement comes after a federal judge ordered the USDA to fully fund SNAP benefits in November following a lawsuit from a group of municipalities and nonprofits, as well as another lawsuit by North Carolina Attorney General Jeff Jackson and 24 other Democratic governors and attorneys general. Previously, the Trump administration attempted to unlawfully withhold November SNAP benefits entirely and then attempted to only issue partial SNAP payments despite having the ability to fully fund the program.

"After weeks of fighting the Trump administration's unlawful actions, help is finally on the way for 1.4 million North Carolinians who rely on SNAP to make the ends meet, including 34,000 households in my district," **said Congresswoman Adams.** "This funding was only administered because Democrats sued the USDA to release SNAP benefits and stop holding the American people hostage. The Trump administration has made it clear that they have no desire to administer SNAP and will choose to let people go hungry unless they are forced to do so. This is far from the last fight SNAP faces and Democrats are ready to defend the lifesaving program because in the richest country in the world, no one should go to bed hungry."

The Trump administration is currently attempting to appeal the federal court's decision requiring them to fully fund November SNAP benefits. They are choosing to contest a court order rather than ensure SNAP recipients have enough to put food on the table.

"I want to thank our food banks and food pantries for continuing to step up and meet the moment for our community," **Adams continued.** "These organizations were on the front lines while hundreds of thousands of North Carolinians were unsure where their next meal was coming from. We must continue investing in our region's feeding organizations because in uncertain times, they have always been there for us."

Congresswoman Adams is committed to ensuring North Carolina's SNAP program will not be penalized under new state cost-share provisions established in the Republicans' "One Big Ugly Bill" which punishes states for how accurately they administer SNAP. Delays and payment issues for November SNAP benefits rest on the Trump administration's actions, not North Carolina.

Due to the Trump Administration's delays, North Carolina SNAP recipients are currently being issued 65% of their regular SNAP benefits, with an additional 35% expected to come as soon as this weekend.
