Trustees are responsible for keeping elected officials informed of the implications of legislative actions that may have a bearing on the college.

Community Support Services Department Launches Needs Assessment Study to Inform Deployment of Veteran Services

The [Mecklenburg County Veteran Services Division](#) in partnership with the [D'Aniello Institute for Veterans and Military Families \(IVMF\) at Syracuse University](#), and [Veterans Bridge Home \(VBH\)](#), has launched a community-wide survey to learn more about Mecklenburg County's service gaps, along with the needs of veterans and military community members, and how they would like to participate in service navigation.

This survey is part of the County's ongoing efforts to better understand the needs of veterans that reside in the county. The results of this community wide-survey will inform outreach and engagement tactics and strategies geared toward the county's military-connected community.

The brief and confidential questionnaire features questions about veterans' needs, their experiences accessing resources for the military community, and how they would like to be engaged by veteran-serving organizations in the future. The survey is open through Jan. 30, 2026 and can be accessed at Veterans.MeckNC.gov.



Promises Made, Promises Kept: County Continues to Deliver, 30 Days Following Disruption of SNAP Benefits

Dec. 1, 2025, marks 30 days since approximately 138,500 Mecklenburg County residents, who depended on SNAP benefits for food and nutrition services, experienced a disruption in their benefits, as a result of the federal government shutdown. Though SNAP benefits have since been restored following the end of the shutdown, Mecklenburg County is continuing to help residents feeling the impact of the interruption.

In the days leading up to the one-month mark, Mecklenburg County distributed nearly 1,000 frozen turkeys and boxes of side dishes, at the Ella B. Scarbrough Community Resource Center, during its first ever Saturdays on Stitt Turkey Giveaway on Nov. 22. [See photos from the event here.](#)

At the onset of the crisis, Mecklenburg County announced \$740,000 in FY2026-approved funding to support multiple efforts to ensure residents had access to groceries and nutritional food options for their families. Mecklenburg County and its partners continue to provide resources to families and individuals in need, to date:

- More than 9,000 individuals have received a 7-day supply of groceries through Nourish Up's food pantries, mobile mass distribution sites and food shares.
- More 1,000 residents have collected 2-day food boxes.
- Community members have donated more than 1,500 pounds of food at the County's donation boxes.

County's Partnership with Salvation Army Leads to Groundbreaking for the Center of Hope

On Nov. 19, [Mecklenburg County](#), in collaboration with the [Salvation Army of Greater Charlotte](#), and the City of Charlotte, celebrated the groundbreaking of an expansion project at the Salvation Army's Center of Hope shelter on Spratt Street.

The project was a result of funding from [Community Development Block Grant](#) (CDBG) funds, the City of Charlotte, private sector, and more than \$3 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds that Mecklenburg County provided the Salvation Army of Greater Charlotte.

The expansion will allow the organization to expand its services and programing for women, children and veterans experiencing homelessness.
