

The Circle of Humanity is a Charlotte-based, community-driven initiative that brings together two powerful symbols of human resilience and justice:

- The **existing Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Statue**, which will remain in its current location
- A **new Holocaust Memorial Sculpture**, to be installed nearby

Together, these memorials will be united by a **new urban plaza**, created through a public Request for Proposals (RFP) process, forming a shared space dedicated to:

Remembrance • Education • Justice • Human Dignity


